Dear Friends of the FLUFF Pack,

In June 2005, I founded **Four Legged Friends Foundation (FLUFF)** not knowing what the organization would become three and a half years later. As I look back, I am honored by and grateful for people like you that continue to support our efforts. In 2008, FLUFF was able to help save 30 dogs and cats by providing medical care through **Another Sunny Day Fund**. Along with L.A. Animal Services we also assisted rescue groups adopt out 50 dogs and cats at the Spring and Fall Bow Wow Meows held in Brentwood.

Looking ahead into 2009, I am hoping to touch many more lives by increasing the number of pets we assist. Through our Another Sunny Day Fund we would like to double the number of animals saved and begin expanding the program to assist seniors, the disabled and the sick that cannot afford to provide daily care to their pets (walking dogs, changing litter boxes, feeding, etc.).

Our **Give Me a Paw** rating scale for veterinarians has been launched. We requested clients and supporters to complete opinion surveys on their own veterinarians and submit them to us. Your input can be included by visiting www.flff.org/sunnyday.html. It is our intention in 2009 to post online the results of the surveys that will list the ratings of veterinarians to help people find a qualified vet that is most appropriate to fit their needs, both medically and financially.



The successful new program, **Dancing with the Dogs**, was created in 2008 to showcase the human-animal bond and the joy dogs bring to our lives. FLUFF plans to hold Dancing with the Dogs “fun competitions” at other adoption events and schedule performances at nursing and retirement homes, foster care centers, and schools. We also intend to have Dancing with the Dogs showcase with rescue groups and shelters at local fairs and expos to provide entertainment, education and increased adoptions.

FLUFF has come along way since June 2005 and I am happy with the direction it is taking to help save, assist and bring sunshine to so many dogs, cats and their families. In order for us to continue moving forward we need to expand our supporters, donors, sponsors and volunteers. For this we need your assistance. All levels are encouraged to participate. It is a great way to have fun with your dog, and dancing with your dog provides him or her exercise, stimulation, confidence and more.

"Dear Sandra,

Thank You Soooo much for the help!!! I truly appreciate it as does my dog. Having all of this happen right around Christmas was like having my dog as a present all over again.

On 12/06/08 he was hit by a car right outside my house. My roommates heard the thud and came running out. The car was going probably about 35 to 40 MPH at a 15 MPH street corner. Boris' back legs got clipped by the tire and he spiraled on the ground. Thank God he wasn't killed. When I picked him up in my arms it was obvious he was in shock. My roommates shined a light on his legs so we could see

how bad it was. There were no bones protruding but a lot of bleeding.

I rushed him to the Emergency Clinic and he had to be hospitalized overnight. The vet told me he had no broken bones and he seemed to be doing fairly well after being hit by a car. They sent him home with me the next day and he was crying the whole day/night until his visit with his regular vet the next day. He did not urinate or have a bowel movement for over 24 hours. I was so worried about him because every time I tried to take him out to go to the bathroom you could tell he needed to but he couldn't because of the pain in his legs and the fact that he couldn't walk.

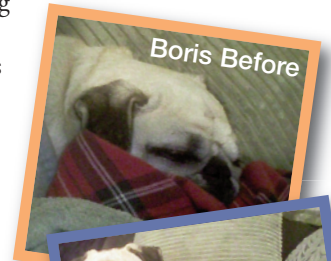
His regular vet hospitalized him again and said if they did not stabilize Boris he would die. He had to be attached to a catheter which drained over a liter of urine from his bladder... no wonder he was crying so much!!!

Boris had surgery on 12/11/08 and came home the next day. He still had a limp in his walk due to a torn ligament but at least

he was walking and alive. He had his staples removed the day after Christmas and is getting back to his old self.

Thank you so much again to **Another Sunny Day Fund** and

to all the people who contribute to it for helping to save my dog's life. He is almost like a child to me. I have had him for the past eight years of my life and he almost comes with me almost everywhere. Everyone who has ever met him tells me he is so well behaved and almost has the personality of a human, not a dog. This is truly the best Christmas present I could ever ask for. Thank you SOOOOOOO much!"
